## Rabbi's Message

It isn't too often that we get to witness history being made but that was what I experienced last month at the annual conference of the Central Conference of American Rabbis. We gathered in Washington, D.C., this year, but what made this conference historic could have happened anywhere: and that was the installation of Rabbi Janet Marder as the first female president of the CCAR. Rabbi Marder was ordained a year before me (she in 1979, I in 1980, she in New York, I in Cincinnati) at a time when we were not even sure anyone would ever hire a female rabbi. We certainly never dreamed that one of us might ascend so quickly to the presidency of the CCAR. Rabbi Marder's installation also coincided with the 30th anniversary of the ordination of Rabbi Sally Priesand, the first woman to be ordained by the Reform Movement in this country. We, the women, were all called to the Torah to share an aliyah in honor of the doubly-momentous occasion.

I don't always get to go to these conferences these days unless I am invited to be on the program. There are always compelling reasons not to go, which is what had kept me away for the last four years. Yet this was one conference I just couldn't miss. I do not know Rabbi Janet Marder in other than a casual collegial way (in those days, we all knew each other), but I know how hard she must have worked to reach this moment. As we all stood at the Torah together, we celebrated both Rabbi Marder's personal achievements and also the success of women rabbis as a group. We all felt inspired, proud and not a little emotional as the memories washed over us.

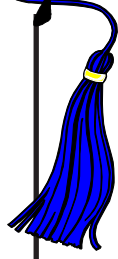

## **Introduction to Judaism Class**

A 16-session course designed to give participants a basic understanding of Jewish belief and practice will be offered in Morristown. The class is open to all individuals who are considering conversion to Judaism; interfaith couples; Jews by birth and non-Jews who wish to obtain a basic adult-level knowledge of Judaism.

The course will approach Jewish tradition - faith, people, customs - through a study of the holiday and life cycles of Judaism. A basic reading knowledge of Hebrew will also be included.

Classes will meet Mondays and Wednesdays for eight weeks, 7:45-9:45 p.m., May 5-June 30. A single registration fee of \$275, or \$225 for UAHC congregation members, includes tuition and one set of books and materials for an individual or a couple.
