## Rabbi's Message

Considering the fact that at no time in the entirety of all American history has there ever been a moment when the Jewish population has exceeded 3% (today it hovers around 21/4%), it is somewhere between remarkable and miraculous to see just how influential and indispensable our People have been to the development of our national identity and civilization. This is a point that has not been lost to the students of the Mike Weiner School of Jewish Learning.

As I've described in previous newsletters, each Sunday we focus on a specific theme, which relates to the contributions of a different American Jew (or Jews) who was either born that week or had a particular milestone contribution that week. In the process, our children of the JCNWJ have come to appreciate that were it not for the Jews of America, our country – indeed our entire world – would no doubt be the lesser for their absence.

Here is a chart of some of the Americans we have studied, and the Jewish lessons we have extrapolated from their lives:

#### A Second Chance

For many people in life, we get one chance to make changes a year. We make New Year's resolutions to try and improve things that we feel we would like to do better. As Jews in the USA, we get two chances. One after Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur, where we take a hard look at ourselves, see where we could have done better. Then, at the beginning of Yom Kippur, we recite Kol Nidre, which basically says that we know that we will fail in some of our promises to God, but if after sincere effort, we fail, we "preatone" for these sins. We Jews get a second chance at the secular New Year to make changes again and to try and redirect our lives in a way that befits us.

In speaking for myself only, here are three things that I would like to change in myself for the coming year. (1) I will make an attempt to reach out to everyone in the congregation personally and see how you are doing and what YOU need from the temple. ## **New Mishaberach List Policy**

Starting with the first service in January 2016 (Jan. 8), we will be doing the Mishaberach prayer differently. We're starting from scratch with a new list of individuals who will need our prayers for healing.

First, Rabbi Dubin will ask congregants who are present at the service if there is anyone they would like to mention. Next, he will read a list of names obtained from congregants who could not be present at the service. Then we will sing the Mishaberach prayer.

If you cannot be present to say the name of the person, then please send that name to Sharon Herson via email (<a href="sharonherson@comcast.net">sharonherson@comcast.net</a>) and indicate how the individual is related or connected to you (so the Rabbi will have that information; it will not be read aloud). Also, please state whether the illness is temporary or long-term. If the former, the name will be on the list for two services (i.e., about one month, unless you indicate something else), and then it will be removed. If the latter, the name will remain on the list until you ask to have it removed. Thank you all for your cooperation.
