## Rabbi's Message

#### A Historic Moment in Philadelphia for LGBT Progress

In late March I had the pleasure of attending the Central Conference of American Rabbi's Convention in Philadelphia. I enjoyed over four days of intense learning, prayer, and collegial connection. The highlight, however, was being present at the installation and celebration of my colleague Rabbi Denise Edger as president of the CCAR. I had the pleasure of sitting on the CCAR Board of Trustees with Rabbi Edger and personally know her as a strong leader, caring soul, passionate voice for justice, and astute thinker. Awed by her talents, I am excited to have her lead my professional organization which is a leading voice in the international Jewish and non-Jewish communities. However, her appointment is historic, as she is the first openly homosexual rabbi to serve as the President of our rabbinical organization.

The joy of Rabbi Edger's presidency is heightened by the coincidence that this convention marked the 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the CCAR's Resolution on Homosexuality and the Rabbinate which paved the way for openly gay and lesbian rabbis to have a welcomed place in our Conference. The installation of Rabbi Edger was a proud moment for her, her family, her congregation, and all the Reform rabbis present.

## Rabbi's Message (cont.)

In her installation address, Rabbi Edger raised many important issues to our community that she hopes to focus on during her presidency. As a community, we were inspired to renew our efforts to affect change in our world. However, it was her reflection on her historic appointment that touched my heart. Later in the conference, Rabbi Yoel Kahn spoke of his journey from hiding his sexual orientation and living in fear during rabbinical school to finally being able to come out as a rabbi who is gay. While I am proud of how far my Reform Jewish community, and America in general, has come, I was pained to witness the hurt and discrimination my colleagues have had to endure. I also know that many still live with these wrongs every day in our Jewish community, in America, and certainly throughout the world.

At Passover, my family always includes on our seder plate an orange, Dr. Susannah Heschel's symbol of inclusion of gays and lesbians and others who are marginalized within the Jewish community. (To learn more:

As we mark Passover this year, I will celebrate the progress made, as embodied by Rabbi Edger's CCAR appointment, and rededicate myself to the work still unfinished to protect LGBT rights everywhere.

## Passover Recipes


#### Pineapple Farfel

#### Ingredients

- 3 Cups of Matzah Farfel
- 1 Cup of Sugar
- 2 Cans of Crushed Pineapple (drained)
- 1 Stick of Margarine
- 8 Eggs

#### Instructions

Melt margarine. Add eggs, one at a time, and sugar. Beat well. Soak matzah in hot water for 3 minutes. Drain well and add to mixture. Add pineapple.



#### Chocolate Mousse Cake

#### Ingredients

5 Eggs

6 oz. Package of Bittersweet Chocolate Chips ¼ Cup of Margarine (half a stick)

1 Cup of Sugar

#### Instructions

Melt margarine and chocolate together. Stir until smooth. Cool mixture. Beat egg yolks and sugar together. Beat egg whites separately.

Add cooled chocolate mixture to egg yolks and sugar. Fold in beaten egg whites. Pour into 8" or 9" spring form pan.



Bake at 350 degrees for 40-50 minutes. Serve with whipped cream, as cake is very rich.

The morning will feature a presentation by Valerie Thayer, Ph. D entitled. Never Forget: How Do American Jews Remember the Shoah. This program is free to the community. On Monday, April 20 at 7pm, a screening of The Other will be shown at the Birnbaum JCC, Bridgewater. This film features Tova Friedman -- one of the youngest children to survive Auschwitz -- who discovers that her daughter, Taya (also featured in the film) has hired (Stephanie) a nanny from Germany. The film also features Taya, Stephanie and Reinhold, a staff member at Raritan Valley Community College, whose father was an SS officer during the Holocaust. This film challenges the participants to confront difficult questions about co-existence. This program is co-sponsored by the Raritan Valley Community College Institute of Holocaust and Genocide Studies, Shimon and Sara Birnbaum Jewish Community Center and Jewish Family Service of Somerset, Hunterdon & Warren Counties. This program is free to the community. The Irma Horowitz Film Series on Thursday, April 30, 6:30pm at the Birnbaum JCC. The evening features a Falafel Dinner, and Israeli Short Films presented by the Ma'Aleh School of Television Film and the Arts in Jerusalem. Films shown include: And Thou Shalt Love, Fair Fight, A Woman Laughed and Memory Game. Hosted by the Birnbaum JCC, Bridgewater (Fee: \$12/person in advance or \$15/person day of event). Coming up in May...Celebrate Israel Parade in New York City, Sunday, May 31. A bus will be taking spectators into New York for the annual Celebrate Israel Parade on 5th Avenue in New York City. 
