Rabbi's message

When I sat with our Confirmation class this week, I thought of how things have changed in the last nineteen years. The world somehow seemed safer. It was pre-9/11. We still felt invincible in our country. No one would have dreamed that two brothers would wreak havoc on the Boston Marathon. No one thought that a young man would shoot up an elementary school in Newtown. I found myself wondering how to prepare our students for a future that is so uncertain.

The changes are not all bad, of course. Nineteen years ago, if I wanted to communicate with Confirmation, I had to pick up the phone or mail flyers. Now, I email. They don't all read their email, but their parents do. When students want to communicate, they text. If a student is late to class, someone always has a cell phone and can send a message so we can find out if he overslept or if she forgot.

When students need to know how to chant a Torah or haftarah portion, I email an mp3. No tapes, no CDs. One year when the class was a large one, they wrote their Confirmation sermon together via Facebook.

And yet, so much hasn't changed. Students read from the same Torah (well, not the same scroll – this year will be the first time they read from our new Torah). The words of the Ten Commandments remain the same. The prayerbook is the same one they used when they became b'nai mitzvah. Most importantly, they still just like being together, whether on the retreat or in the Simcha Room for class.

And so when I find myself worrying about how to prepare them for the years after Confirmation, I reassure myself that we are already doing the things we can to prepare them – and to prepare ourselves – for a future that can't be predicted. We are teaching them the words of our tradition. We are inviting them into the experience of being a community, even if the community of the Confirmation Class is a small one. We are letting them know each one of them is important to all of us. And we are training them to be leaders of their future communities.

If you have never been to a Confirmation Service, you have missed something special. All of our classes participate, from K-1 through Confirmation. The liturgy celebrates Shavuot, the holiday that commemorates the receiving of the Torah and the commitment to keep Torah and transmit it. We all stand at Sinai again as we did thousands of years ago. That is something that hasn't changed; it is eternal.

Come join us.

President's message

Last night while interviewing a prospective rabbi, he asked a very interesting question of Kelsey and Alex. He asked what their most significant Jewish moment was. While they were answering, it got me thinking about what the most significant Jewish moment in my life was.

I have it narrowed down to two moments, and I would like to share them with you. The first moment occurred when I became the treasurer of the temple 14 years ago. On Yom Kippur I was to give the High Holiday appeal as well as chant Torah for the first time since my Bar Mitzvah, which was 30 years earlier. I had practiced my Torah portion of three lines for at least 3 months and had it down to the point where I was very confident about it. The appeal I had written between Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur, had practiced it twice and was very nervous about giving the speech. When my name was called for my aliyah and I did the blessings, I looked at the Torah being expected to read it for the first time in a very long time. I began to shake. At that moment, I could feel the awesomeness and holiness in our Torah.

The second moment was when the adult B'nai Mitzvah class that Charlotte and I had taught was called to the Torah. Every one of the seven women was scared of reading from the Torah. But to watch each one of them come to the Torah, recite the blessings and read or chant from the Torah was truly inspiring to me.

In this vein, I hope that every one of you will take the opportunity that we will have on May 5th to be able to perform one of the 613 Mitzvot that are listed in the Torah. This mitzvah is to be able to write your own Torah. Since the chance of any of us writing a complete Torah is very, very slim, we can, with the help of Sofer Winer, complete a letter in our new Torah. In my life, I have never had the opportunity to do this, and am anxious, nervous and excited about getting this opportunity.

Please join me and let's make this a great day at the temple, one that will not soon be forgotten.

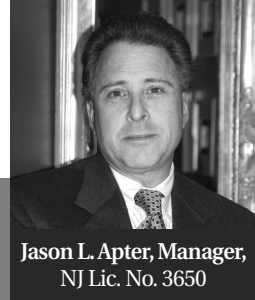
