Rabbi's Message

Dear Friends,

If asked to name the holiest month of the Jewish year, most of us might say *Tishrei*, the month during which we gather for Rosh HaShanah, Yom Kippur, Sukkot, *and* Simchat Torah. Four major holidays in just over three weeks. Talk about a jam-packed month! Especially when we compare *Tishrei* to *Elul*, the month just before, the contrast could not be any clearer: *Tishrei* has four major holidays; *Elul* has exactly none.

All the same, maybe we have it wrong. Maybe *Elul* <u>is</u>, in fact, a whole lot holier than we often think it is. Maybe, in fact, *Elul* is the single holiest month of the entire Jewish year! Truth be told, I think it is. And here's why.

Even though *Elul* is one of only three months in the Jewish year devoid of a single significant holiday, as I see it, it also happens to be a month filled with incomparable holiness, because during *Elul*, every last one of its 29 days focuses on the same extraordinary quest of deep personal reflection and preparation so as to begin the coming New Year with the best possible chance for spiritual success. Though we know it is incumbent upon us to engage in self-reflection, atonement, and personal growth every other day of the year, too, during *Elul*,

which begins tomorrow evening (Monday, Sept. 2), our spiritual trek of introspection rises to a whole new level of daily pursuit.

We are taught by Rabbi Judah Loew ben Bezale (also referred to as the Maharal of Prague) that

Throughout the entire month of Elul, even more than eating and sleeping, a person should look deeply into their soul in order to examine their acts, so that they will be able to confess.

What an appealing way to spend the month! All the same, as alluring as such an endeavor may sound, simply being told to engage in self-reflection and confession hardly ensures we'll actually succeed at doing it – or even try. This is why, recognizing that written instructions alone can sometimes be less than entirely sufficient to move us to meaningful action, tradition instructs us to sound the shofar each day (other than on Shabbat), in order that we will have our own personal "spiritual alarm clocks" waking us up to action. In addition, understanding that generosity has the capacity to unlock the very best in us, we make the conscious effort to intensify our *tzadaka* practice over the course of the 29 days of *Elul*.

Fortunately, while Judaism teaches that God truly is accessible to the genuine seeker every second of every day of every year, we are taught that during the month of *Elul*, God is *especially* available, which, again, gives us the absolute best chances for spiritual success. Ultimately, by the end of the month, assuming we have put in the proper effort, we really will be ready to enter the new year of 5785 with our best foot forward.

If a deep process of such introspection appeals to you, but you don't know where to begin, please make sure you follow our public-facing JCNWJ Facebook page, where I will be posting daily meditations that have been prepared by my colleagues, Rabbi David Young and Rabbi Neal Katz (I hope you follow our members-only Facebook page, too, but for the daily *Elul* meditations, I will be using our public-facing Facebook page). If you don't already follow us on Facebook but would like to, and don't know how, please reach out to Suzi, who will be happy to guide you through the process.


