Rabbi's Message

Dear Friends,

With so many Americans being fired from their federal jobs in such quick succession over the past few weeks, I've been thinking a lot about how workers ought to be treated. While Jewish tradition by no means offers blanket protection for permanent employment, at the same time, there are clear expectations that workers should be treated with dignity and respect at all times. As such, there must be reasonable expectations for job security and fair dismissal procedures, safe work environments, and timely payment of wages.

With regard to one who hires a laborer, and at midday the *laborer* . . . was gripped with fever and could not continue to work, if he is a hired laborer, he gives him his wage; if he is a contractor, he gives him his contracted payment. -- Babylonian Talmud (Bava Metzia 77a)

While this passage from Bava Metzia 77a doesn't address the topic of job security directly, it does make it clear workers have to be paid what is due to them, even when circumstances beyond their control prevent them from completing a job. Of course, businesses do have to function efficiently, so there will be times, perhaps, when employers have no economic choice other than to let some of its workforce go, – even when the

affected workers have done nothing wrong – but even then, there are clear expectations of justice and compassion throughout the process. One of the obligations placed on employers is to guarantee that workers will never be left unexpectedly and suddenly without income.

"Do not oppress a needy and poor worker...You must pay out the wages due on the same day, before the sun sets."

-- Deuteronomy 24:14-15

On this topic of income, while Jewish law does not require never-ending ongoing payment after the worker stops working, the principles of *derech eretz* (ethical treatment) require that employers treat their workers in a fair and respectful manner, and that compensation be provided in a timely manner for work completed. By extension, when workers invested their own money into a job by purchasing equipment, building a workshop, or planting a field, for example, with the agreed upon expectation that the employer will complete agreed-upon contracts, Jewish law requires that such investments be made whole by the employer, even if the employee is terminated (without cause).

"Just as the employer is warned not to steal the wages of the poor or delay them, so too, the worker is warned not to steal the work of the employer by neglecting his duties, working lazily, or wasting time."

Maimonides (Mishneh Torah, Hilchot Sechirut 13:7)

While this passage does not address severance explicitly, it does suggest that employers have ethical obligations to their workers, just as workers have obligations to their employer. Workers are ethically bound to provide an honest day's work, and employers are bound similarly to provide an honest day's pay. Employment is a mutual relationship with expectations of honesty, fairness, and responsibility. That said, Jewish legal expectations recognize that because employers have so much more power than workers, so too do they have so much more responsibility to behave justly, ensuring that workers not be dismissed unfairly or without due cause, and that undue hardship to the employee be avoided whenever possible.

When you set a slave free, do not let him go empty-handed:

Furnish him out of the flock, threshing floor, and vat, with which your God יהוה has blessed you.

Some later Jewish legal experts even go so far as to demand that all workers be given severance pay or transition support when their term of employment comes to an end, whether voluntary or by firing. The reasoning is that if a mere slave is entitled to bonus pay upon release, all the more so should free workers be entitled to the same. To part ways with a loyal worker so suddenly and completely in a way that will deprive them of transition resources, according to this Jewish school of thought, is prohibited. In the end, it is fair to say that Jewish tradition emphasizes fairness, justice, and compassion in the employer-employee relationship, including issues of job security and ethical dismissal. While traditional Jewish law does not explicitly mandate ironclad job protection, several key principles suggest that employers have a moral responsibility to ensure job stability, avoid unjust dismissals, and guard against undue financial burden should an employee be terminated through no fault of their own.
