Rabbi's Message

Dear Friends,

As we prepare to enter the Days of Awe, Rosh Hashanah arrives not just as one of the new years on our calendar, but as a spiritual imperative – perhaps more urgent this year than ever.

In a world reeling from unrest, injustice, war, division, bigotry, and increasing antisemitism – both near and far – the Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur call us back to our core. They remind us that renewal is not only possible, but necessary. That even when the world feels heavy and about to fall, our tradition gives us a rhythm for repair: *Teshuvah* (return to our best selves), *Tefillah* (prayer), and *Tzedakah* (justice).

Rosh Hashanah asks us to pause. To take stock. To see not just what's broken out there, but what needs healing within ourselves and in our relationships. It's a time to ask hard questions: Have I listened deeply? Have I acted justly? Have I been present – with compassion, with courage, with generosity, with hope?

In the face of so much noise, our shofar cuts through with clarity – a wake-up call to what matters most. It urges us to recenter our values, to reconnect with community, and to recommit to the work of creating a more just and loving world.

To be sure, Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur are deeply personal, but they are not intended to be experienced alone. These sacred days require our presence – not only before God, but before one another. There is power in coming together,

Adult Education

LET'S FIND OUT, Part I: Adult Education at the JCNWJ in the year 5786

Rabbi Dubin will teach two courses, one in the late fall and one in the spring, that will deal with questions of interest to many of us. Attendance in person is preferable, but Zoom will be available as needed.

The first will deal with the **History of Modern Zionism**. Rabbi Dubin will cover significant historical events, personalities, and writings, beginning in the mid-nineteenth century and ending with the current situation in Israel/Gaza. Sessions will meet in the simcha room on Sunday afternoons, 1:00–2:30: BYO lunch and come around 12:30.

Dates: November 9, November 16, and November 23 (Zoom only); December 7 and December 14.

The second course will be a theological exploration of **G-d/Adonai/Elohim: Who? What? Where?** And any other questions that participants may have. The meeting time and place will be the same as for the first series; the precise spring dates and number of sessions will be announced later.


